One time payment

All students who were enrolled at a German university and had their ordinary residence or first residence in Germany as of December 1st 2022 are eligible to apply to receive 200€ to help pay with the rise in energy costs. Application will be possible starting on **March 15th** on the website www.einmahlzahlung200.de. Unfortunately, no apparent thought has been given to translating the official websites. All the better that there are some universities that provide information about the application process in English. So, in case you are unsure about auto-translating the official website, other options are to look up - for example - "Uni Tübingen One-off payment" or "200 Euro For Students Studierendenwerk Stuttgart", which both offer English translations.

365€-Ticket Baden-Württemberg

From **March 1**, it is possible for all under 27 years old to purchase the 365€ ticket. This allows you to use **all local and regional public transport** in Baden-Württemberg for one year. The ticket can be purchased at the points of sale of the transport association in which the purchaser lives or studies.
