Fachschaft Informatik

Alright, so the FIN publishes the Klokurier and has a bunch of mailing lists, but who is this FIN actually, and what does it have to do with me? Fear not, these questions can be answered, because this Toilet Paper has space for shameless self-promotion FINfos:

"FIN" stands for Fachbereichsvertretung (informally: Fachschaft, literally: "department representatives", actually: "student representatives/council") Informatik. Fachschaft actually refers to all students enrolled in a computer science program (that is, Informatics, Media Informatics, Software Engineering, Artificial Intelligence, or Cognitive Systems). The group of people who are actively involved in this is also referred to as the active Fachschaft.
